ISI COMPETITION FOR YOUNG STATISTICIANS FROM DEVELOPING COUNTRIES

The International Statistical Institute (ISI) has announced the Second Competition among young statisticians from developing countries, who are invited to submit a paper on any topic within the broad field of statistics for possible presentation at the Centenary Session of ISI to be held in Amsterdam, Netherlands, August 12–22, 1985. Participation in the Competition is open to nationals of developing countries who are living in a developing country, and who will not be older than 32 years of age in 1985.

Papers submitted must be unpublished original works, which may include university theses. The papers submitted will be examined by an international Jury of distinguished statisticians who are to select the three best papers. Their decision will be final. The authors of the winning papers will be invited to present their papers personally at the Centenary Session of ISI in Amsterdam with all expenses paid (i.e. round trip airline ticket from his/her place of residence to Amsterdam plus a lump sum to cover living expenses). Manuscripts should be submitted in time to reach the ISI not later than November 1, 1984.
