International Meeting on "Problems of Compilation of Input-Output-Tables" May 19-25, 1985, Baden near Vienna, Austria

Preliminary Program and Call for Papers

At the 17th General Conference of the International Association for Research in Income and Wealth held in 1981, input—output-statistics were discussed on an international scientific level. On this occasion some of the participants launched in an informal way the idea of continuing the exchange of experience among experts in IO-statistical work, especially as regards the concepts of a make-use system. This idea has been followed up by the Austrian Statistical Society, which is arranging a meeting on input—output-statistics with the support of the Austrian Central Statistical Office.

This meeting would be rather small-sized (about 50 participants), but open to anyone who is engaged or otherwise interested in practical issues of compilation of input—output tables, their various versions and derivatives.

The following topics have been selected:

- —Lay-out of table frameworks as regards desirable sub-matrices and options for extensions; regional tables
- —Feedbacks into primary statistics
- -Reconciliation with national accounts
- -Balancing procedures
- -Methods of extrapolation; problems of comparability over time
- -Problems of valuation; tables in constant prices; productivity
- —Compilation of import matrices
- —Use of computer and structure of data bases; optimal use of basic statistics with a view to technologies.

It is intended to publish the papers in a proceedings volume. The conference language will be English.
